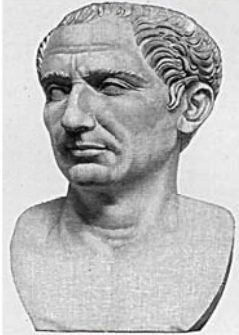
## Time to play, because it's St. Patrick's Day!

## Potable Reuse isn't so Profuse (By Harrison Pearce)

Water recycled for irrigation called reclaimed water may soon be further treated in the City of San Diego Water Department . This endeavor is currently tested in the North City water department pilot plant. First the effluent is filtered and sent to a central storage tank. It is then given an anti-scalant and pumped through reverse osmosis filters. It is then sent into the North City recycled water system for use in irrigation because this is a pilot plant so the water has not been approved for human consumption yet. It currently seems to be more efficient and cost effective in the long run than desalinization. It is important to note that in the water industry and in other sciences, most things aren't 100 percent pure. Contaminants always exist in water, even in tap water or ultraclean RO water. It is the level of regulated contaminants in parts per million or even billion that matter. If something is not detected it is because it is beyond the detection limit. We are in a drought and will have even less

water in the coming years, which is why we need to recycle our water supply.

## International Woman's Day I say yay!

International Women's Day has been observed since the early 1900's. Great unrest and critical debate were occurring amongst women. Women's oppression and inequality was spurring women to become more vocal and active in campaigning for change. Then in 1908, 15,000 women marched through New York City demanding shorter hours, better pay and voting rights. In accordance with a declaration by the Socialist Party of America, the first National Woman's Day (NWD) was observed across the United States on the 28<sup>th</sup> of February. Women continued to celebrate NWD on the last Sunday of February until 1913. In 1910 a second International Conference of Working Women was held in Copenhagen. A woman named a Clara Zetkin tabled the idea of an International Women's Day. She proposed that every year in every country there should be a celebration on the same day - a *Women's Day* - to press for their demands. The conference of over 100 women from 17 countries, representing unions, socialist parties, working women's clubs, and the first three women elected to the Finnish parliament, greeted Zetkin's suggestion with unanimous approval and thus International Women's Day was the result.
